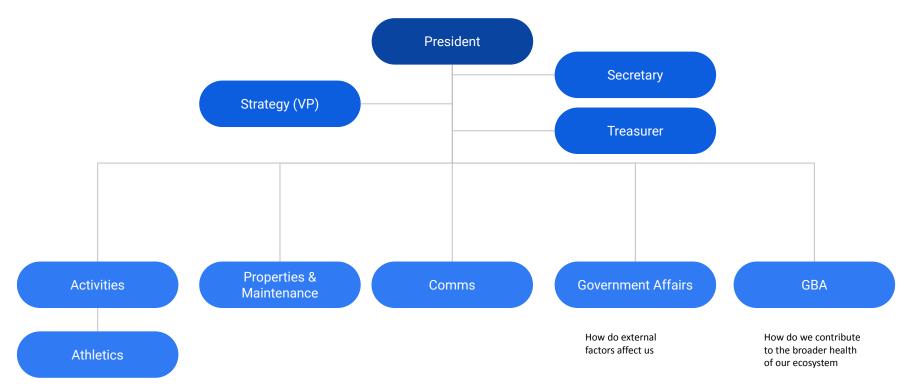




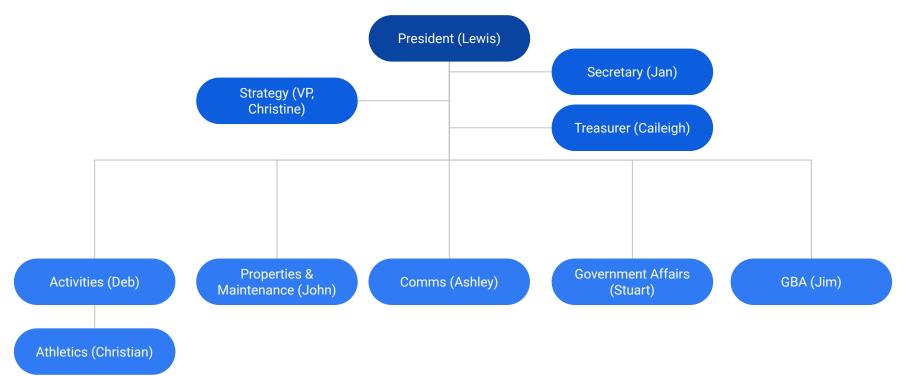
Board Structure - Current

Land Stewardship Committee

A newly-revised Conservation Agreement with GBLT:

- Read the agreement
- Has not dramatically changed from draft sent out last year
- Key elements/changes:
 - Scope of lands & term
 - Recognition that future uses can be added to those currently permitted
 - Reduction of the Club's obligations

We've received expert independent legal advice on the quality of the agreement with no issues identified



Land Stewardship Committee

Summary of next steps:

- **1.** GBLT to provide a Baseline Data Report, documenting flora and fauna, for inclusion in the Conservation Agreement and the Club to obtain formal legal opinion (Summer 2023).
- **2.** A membership vote to proceed with easement (Summer 2023).

Assuming a **YES** vote:

- **3.** A title report from a real estate lawyer that reviews and updates legal descriptions of parcels owned by Club (late Summer 2023).
- **4.** An appraisal, funded by GBLT, valuing the Club lands under the conservation agreement/easement (Fall 2023).
- **5.** Settle, sign and grant Final Conservation Agreement (Fall 2023).



Three questions were asked:

- 1. Karen McMaster site 94 asked: "why was the land appraisal being done after the community voted?" Karen felt it was part of the risk assessment to have the value of the land before the easement & what the value would be after the easement. The LSC responded that we will have the appraisal numbers prior to the voting.
- 2. John Stephens Site 106 asked "if an activity arises that we wish do on our open lands, would that be permitted?" Answer is yes that is written into the document that if the need arises we would be permitted to use the open land for a new activity.
- 3.Clair Balfour of site 8 asked" What other communities up and down the shore are protected by Georgian Bay Land Trust?" Coghnsene to the south and Tadnac to the north have donated lands. There are more donated lands up the shore.

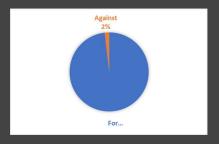
Karen McMaster asked if Pig Island was part of the conservation easement lands.

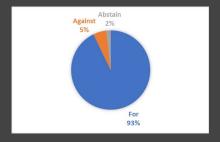
